Genesis 45: 1-15 Joseph is reunited with his brothers.

- 1 Then Joseph was no longer able hold back his feelings in front of his attendants, and he cried out to them, "Leave me!" So no one was present when Joseph made himself known to his brothers —
- 2 but he wept so loudly that all of his Egyptian attendants heard him, and the news of it reached the Pharaoh's palace.
- 3 Joseph said to his brothers, "It is I—Joseph! Is my father really still alive?" The brothers could not answer, so dumbfounded were they.
- 4 Then Joseph said to the brothers, "Come closer to me." When they had come closer he said to them, "I am your brother Joseph, whom you sold into Egypt!
- 5 Please don't rebuke yourselves for having sold me here. God sent me here ahead of you so that I could save your lives.
- There has been famine in the land for two years, and for the next five years there will be no tilling and no harvesting.

- 7 But God sent me ahead of you to guarantee that you will have descendants on earth and to keep you alive as a great body of survivors.
- 8 "So it was not you who sent me here, but God! God has made me Pharaoh's chief counselor, the head of his household and governor of all Egypt.
- 9 Hurry back to our father and give him this message from Joseph: 'God has made me governor of all of Egypt. Come to me here at once! Do not delay.
- 10 You will live here near me in the territory of Goshen, you, your children, your grandchildren, your flocks and herds, and all your possessions.
- 11 I will provide for you here—for the next five years will be years of famine—so that you and your children and all that you own will be spared from destitution.'
- 12 "You can see for yourselves, and so can my brother, Benjamin, that it is I who speak to you.
- 13 Report to our father about how I am honored here in Egypt, and about everything you have seen. Go quickly, now, and bring my father to me!"
- 14 Joseph threw his arms around Benjamin and wept, and Benjamin embraced him and wept too.
- 15 Then he kissed his other brothers, weeping over them as well, and then he and his brothers talked.
