Rev. Joanne's Reflection

Water – too much and there can be destruction and loss of life; too little may cause the same outcome. Its gentle sounds can soothe the soul – waves breaking on a beach, the burbling and tricking sounds of a full spring stream. Conversely when waves crash, when flood waters roar, the sounds can bring fear and anxiety. It is an essential element for everything that lives, and its power can shape rocks and reform mountains.

When the writers of the first creation story in the book of Genesis imagined God creating the world, water was present – as was the Spirit brooding over those waters. When the Israelite people wandered in the wilderness, water was of great concern – as it was for all desert nomadic people. Throughout our scriptures, special names were given to places where water was found, and those locations often became the space where villages and eventually cities could grow.

It is perhaps not surprising that water is a central symbol in our faith tradition, as today we remember that symbolism in Austin's baptism. Water as a sign of the Spirit, water that brings new life, water that renews our spirits as well as our bodies. Simple water transforms to the sacred when we use it in this sacrament, inviting and acknowledging that God's Spirit fills the spaces between the atoms of hydrogen and oxygen.

Jesus saw this in the form of a dove at his own baptism, and knew the power of the living water of God's love to bring change and hope and grace to those who could perceive it. He knew this when he rose from the waters of the Jordan, when he encountered the woman at the well, when he told the man cured of blindness to wash in the pool of Siloam, when he tenderly washed his disciples feet.

Water – sacred, necessary, God's gift. Here is Mississauga, we have an abundance of fresh water close by for drinking, for recreation, and for supporting a variety of wildlife. Lake Ontario, the Credit River, Lake Aquitaine, Crawford Lake, even Mimico Creek. On this first Sunday in the Season of Creation, as we focus on the gift of water, perhaps we can ponder how we treat these waters as sacred in our daily living?

Some years ago, we asked Applewood folk to make a commitment to using refillable water bottles rather than purchasing water. Are you still keeping that promise? Drinking the water from our taps is one way to be reminded daily that water is not a commodity, but an essential need for everyone. Conserving water is another action that can remind us that water is sacred and not to be 'wasted' by leaving taps running unnecessarily, or watering our lawns when other measures can keep grass healthy.

We can learn about our local watershed through organizations like the Credit Valley Conservation Authority, or global water conditions and issues through the work of the United Nations, UNESCO, UNICEF, the World Wildlife Fund or water.org. We can continue to call for safe water to be made available to Indigenous communities in our own country. We All these actions, and our commitment to making good choices for the health of all our waters, can and does make a difference.

Water – crashing at creation, dripping on foreheads at baptism, living, sacred, and a symbol of God's transforming love. We cannot live without it, our bodies need it, out spirits need it, our planet needs fresh, clean water for us all to thrive. How will you treat this gift today?
